# HARBORS OF MEMORY

The “Fishermen of Kumkapı” (Kumkapı Balıkçıları) exhibition at the Ara Güler Museum reflects life on the enchanting waters of the Sea of Marmara, where Asia and Europe meet.

He is the architect of our country’s visual memory. Known as “The Eye of Istanbul,” Ara Güler has also made a name for himself worldwide with his works. In 1961, the “British Journal of Photography” named him one of the world’s seven best photographers. Salvador Dalí, Fikret Mualla, Winston Churchill, Maria Callas, Bertrand Russell, Alfred Hitchcock, Pablo Picasso, Yaşar Kemal, and Federico Fellini are just a few of the famous names he has photographed. Yet, alongside these figures, he is also a master at capturing the everyday life of everyday individuals. He understands well that to be universal, one must deeply grasp and reflect one’s own geography. Once, he said, “They call me The Photographer of Istanbul, but I am a citizen of the world. I am a photojournalist of the world.”

## THE ARA GÜLER MUSEUM

The Ara Güler Museum plays a crucial role in preserving the memory of this significant and versatile artist through his works. The Ara Güler Museum, which opened on August 16, 2018, on Güler's 90th birthday, is a testament to his enduring legacy. Located in Bomontiada, the museum showcases the works of this unique photographer who significantly contributed to the construction of Turkey's visual memory. It aims to present Güler's multifaceted artistic identity, his inspiring, profound life, and his valuable archive.

The museum's previous exhibition "Fishermen of Kumkapı", based on Ara Güler's series "With the Armenian Fishermen of Kumkapı," published in the Jamanak newspaper, has offered

a unique opportunity for photography enthusiasts. Published in 1952, this series provides a fascinating insight into the daily lives of fishermen in Kumkapı and holds a significant place in Güler's career.

The exhibition featured never-before-seen photographs, ephemera related to Kumkapı from the Ara Güler Archives and Research Center, and examples of contact sheets showing Güler's editorial and creative process. The exhibition and accompanying book shed light on the now-vanished Küçük Deniz Street and the fishermen's village, the people who worked there, and a way of life.

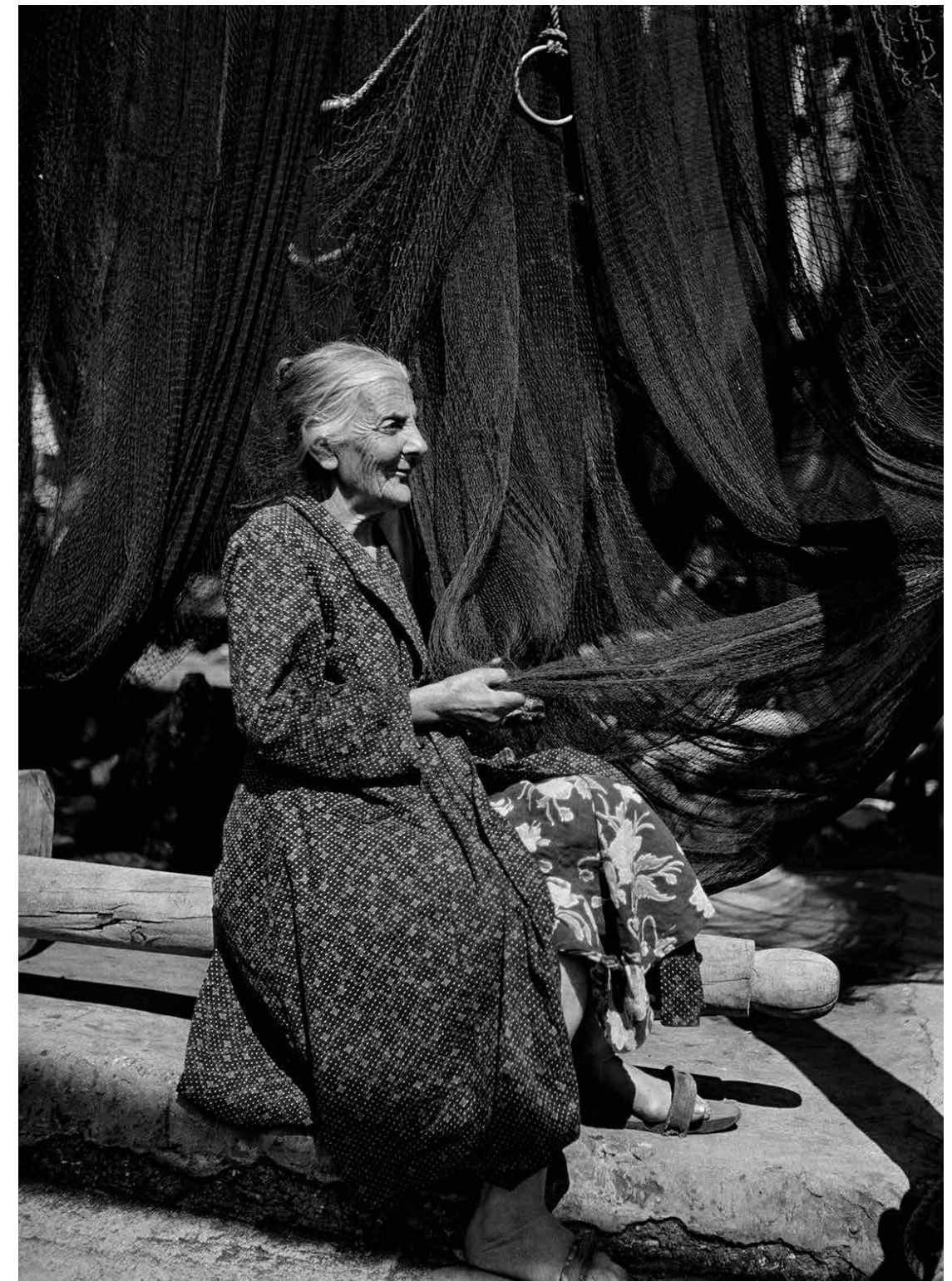

## THE MEMORY OF THE SEA OF MARMARA

Ara Güler, with his strong observational skills, visited the Kumkapı neighborhood many times after 1952. He immortalized the daily lives of the fishermen's headmen, crews, and menders. Through the publication of 'With the Armenian Fishermen of Kumkapı' series, published when Ara Güler was only 24 years old, Ara Güler established his place in the realm of photo-journalism at an early age. Constituting one of his most important works helping him garner acclaim in his profession, this photo-reportage also

serves as a harbinger of Ara Güler's imminent successful international career.

Our Nobel Prize-winning author Orhan Pamuk says of Ara Güler: “Whenever I look at Güler's pictures of Istanbul, I want to rush to my desk and write about this city.” The artist's inspiring, unique photos with the backdrop of the Bosphorus await their visitors.

# MYTHOLOGY



# AND THE SEA

With its infinite depths and mysterious life,  
the sea has always been at the forefront of human curiosity and imagination.

Many myths and legends about the sea actually stem from humans'  
attempts to understand its mysteries and power.

Of course, the meeting point of the sea with myths is not only on the earth's surface;  
there are also many mythological figures and stories related to the sea in the sky.

In Greek mythology, there are three primary gods of the Earth: Zeus (Sky), Poseidon (Seas and oceans), and Hades (Underworld).

Zeus is the equivalent of Jupiter in Roman mythology and is also considered the god of the sky. The equivalent

of Poseidon in Roman mythology is Neptune, known as the god of seas and oceans. Hades' equivalent in Roman mythology is Pluto and is considered the god of the underworld. These three gods represent the three main kingdoms of the universe in Greek and Roman mythologies: the sky, the seas, and the underworld.

THE GODDESS OF LOVE AND BEAUTY, *APHRODITE*

"Aphrodite, they  
called her among  
gods and men,  
for she was born  
of foam."

There are two sources about the birth of Aphrodite, the goddess of love and beauty, known to many of us: the epics of Hesiod and Homer. In "Theogonia," an epic poem written by Hesiod around 730 BCE, it is told that Aphrodite was born from the foamy waves of the sea. In fact, in Greek, Aphros also means foam/sea foam.



WHICH MYTHOLOGY HAS WHICH SEA GOD?

The sea god appears with different names and characteristics in several different mythologies. As we mentioned in Greek mythology, the sea god is Poseidon. Poseidon is the brother of Zeus and one of the three major gods of Mount Olympus. Initially known as the god of the seas, he is later also known as the god of earthquakes and horses.

Roman mythology: In Roman mythology, the equivalent of the Greek god Poseidon is Neptune. Neptune is also considered the god of the seas.  
Nordic mythology: In Nordic mythology, the god of the seas is Njord. Njord is known as the god of the seas, fishing, and sea voyages.

MESOPOTAMIAN MYTHOLOGY:

The god of the seas in Mesopotamian mythology is Enki. Especially the Sumerians saw the sea as the source of life and civilization, and therefore they attached great importance to Enki.

ANATOLIAN MYTHOLOGY:

Did you know that in Anatolia, the sea goddess holds a more valuable place instead of the sea god? "Ak Ana" is known as the sea goddess in Turkish, Tatar, Altai, Yakut, and Chuvash mythologies.  
In Anatolian mythology, Ak Ana has a very long fish tail like a mermaid. Its tail is in a shade of light blue. Sea stars revolve around it. Ak Ana has given life to everything related to the beginning of life, initiating the cycle of life by giving soul to everything.

THE IMPORTANCE OF CONSTELLATIONS IN MYTHOLOGY

In ancient times, the guide of sailors was the Vela constellation. Vela, located in the southern celestial hemisphere, is one of the modern and most well-known 88 constellations. Vela, which means "sail" in Latin, was a constellation that helped sailors find their way in the seas while traveling on the seas.

**Pisces constellation** represents two fish. In Greek mythology, these fish are the ones that Dionysus, the god of wine, and Eros, the god of love, turned into during their escape.

**Whale (Cetus) constellation** is located in the southern hemisphere of the sky and is a fairly large constellation. This constellation represents the sea creature named Cetus in Greek mythology. Cetus is a monster sent by Poseidon and plays an important role in the Perseus myth. In this myth about the rescue of Andromeda, Perseus kills Cetus and thus saves Princess Andromeda. The Whale constellation is considered an important symbol in this mythological story. Due to its position in the sky, it symbolizes the creature sent by the gods to harm the ships sailing in the sea.

HOW WAS THE SKY-SEA RELATIONSHIP IN ANATOLIAN MYTHOLOGY?

There is no specific constellation associated with the sea or a clear story related to the sea in Anatolian mythology. It is generally thought that the sky symbols in Anatolian mythology are related to daily life such as agriculture, hunting, and war. Therefore, there is no clear record or story about sea-related constellations in Anatolian mythology. However, among the local legends and mythological stories of the people living in various regions of Anatolia, there may be motifs related to the sea.

MERMAID LEGEND:

Although not as extensively and systematically included in Anatolian mythology as in Greek or Roman mythology, there are many legends and stories related to the sea in Anatolia as well. The most popular of these legends is

related to mermaids, mysterious creatures living in the depths of the sea.

According to an Anatolian legend, a sailor is caught in a storm in the middle of the sea, and his ship sinks. At that moment, a mermaid living in the depths of the sea saves the sailor and falls in love with him. The sailor is fascinated by the beauty and magical voice of the mermaid and decides to live with her under the sea. However, living in the underwater world of the mermaid means completely separating from the human world for the sailor. The sailor leaves the mermaid and returns to the world of humans. However, the sailor can never forget the mermaid he left behind and misses the time he spent with her.

This legend reflects the relationship of the people living in the coastal regions of Anatolia with the sea and their admiration for the depths of the sea. The mermaid legend is just one of many Anatolian legends that tell of the mystery of the sea and the connection of people with the sea.

Can you tell us a bit about yourself?

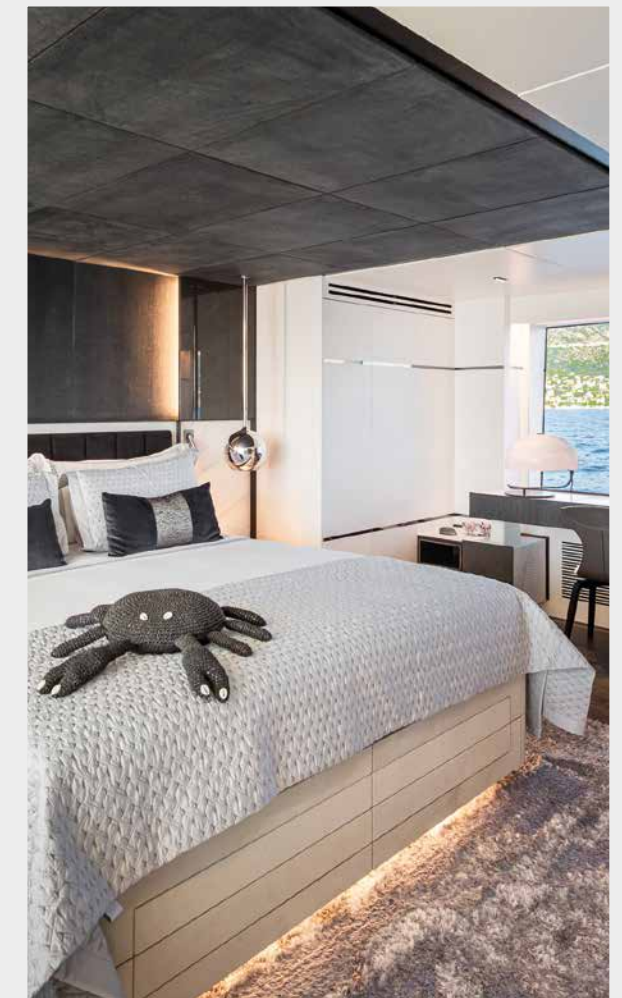

O.O.: I like exploring new places as well as returning to places I'm really fond of.

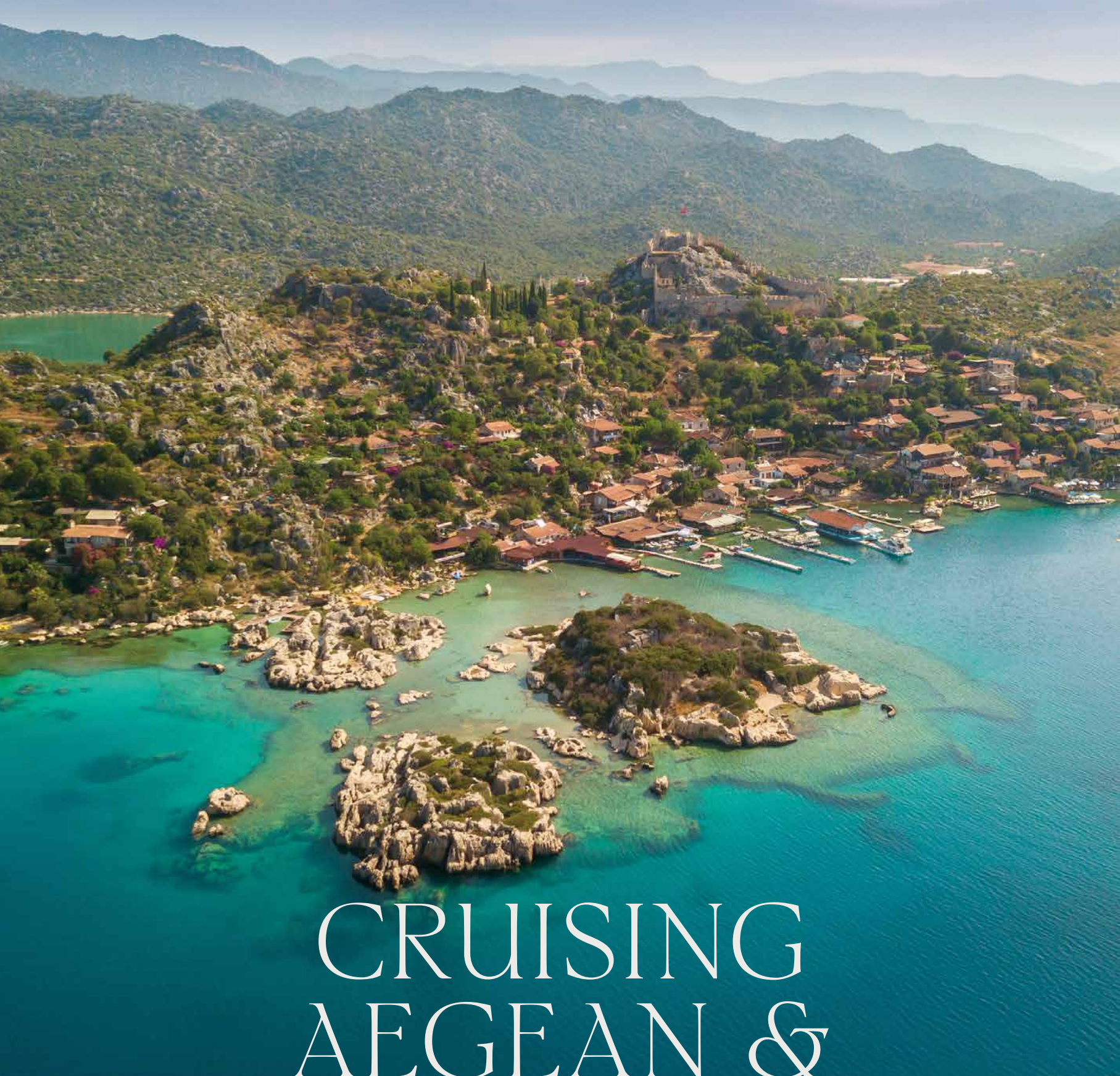
Your destination for getting off the beaten track?

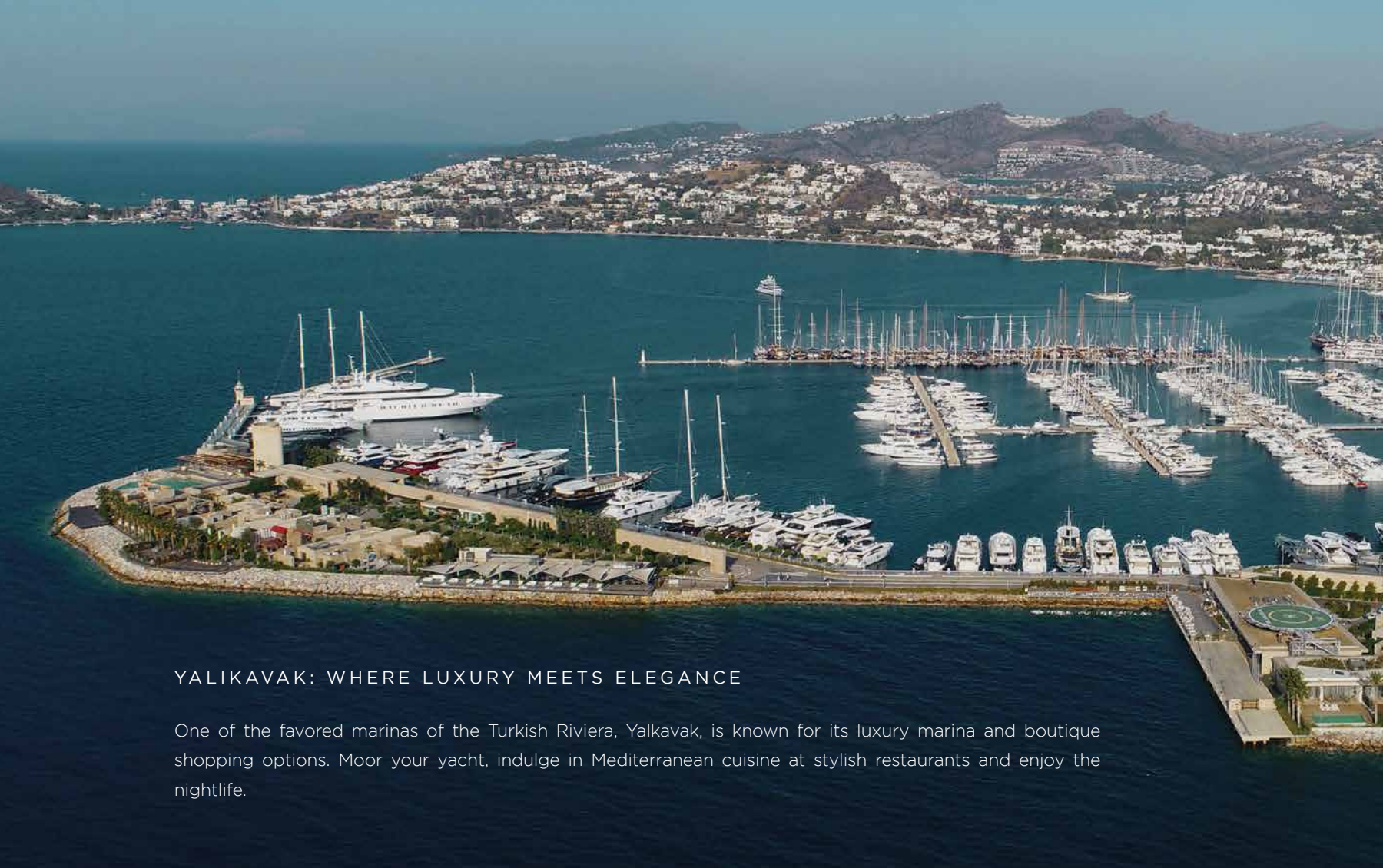

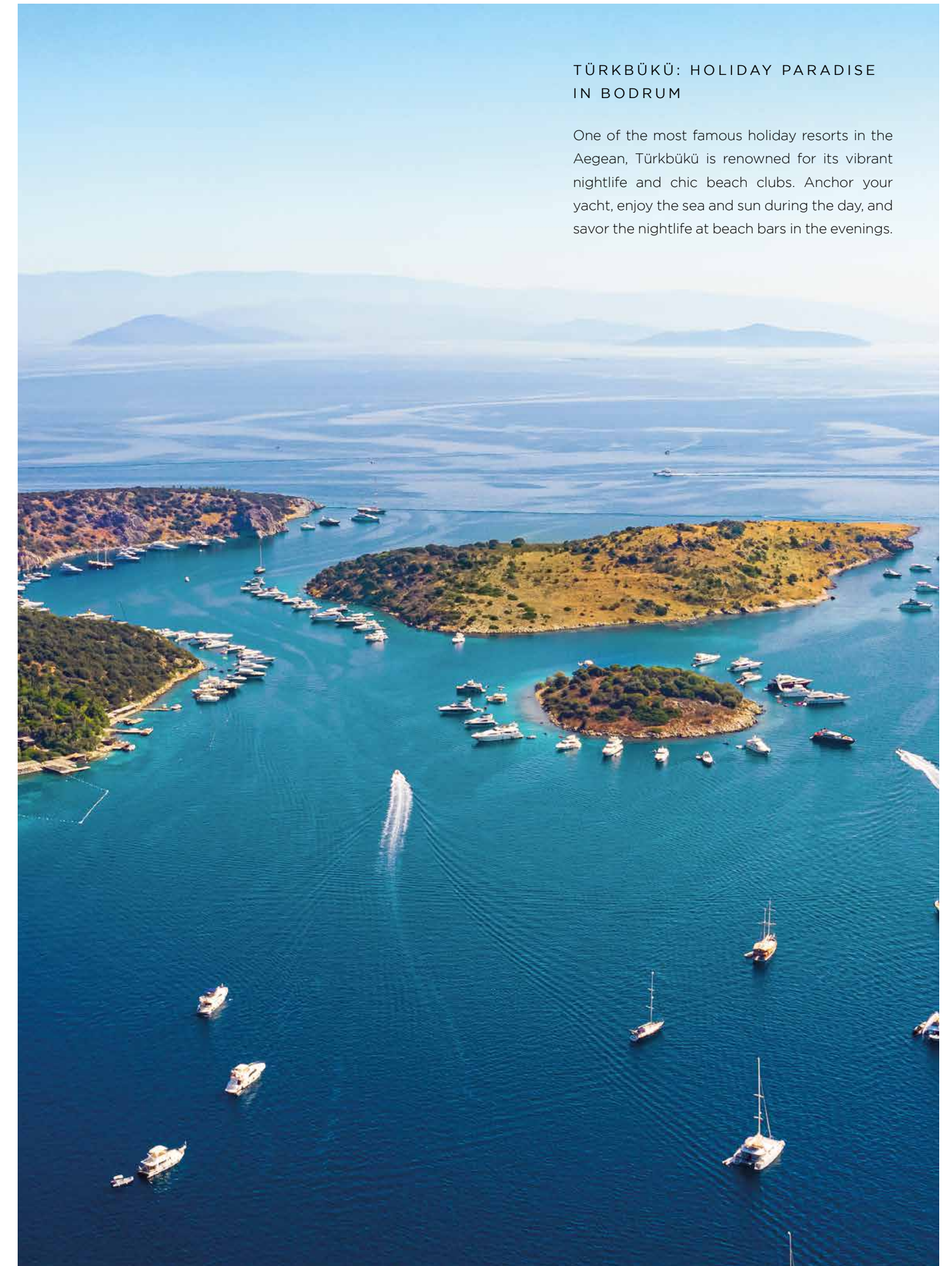

For over 15 years, I have been dedicated to sustainability, working extensively in both the Middle East and Europe. My experience spans various projects and initiatives that promote sustainable practices and enhance environmental performance in diverse sectors. I'm passionate about driving positive change and helping organizations achieve sustainability goals.

How do you see the luxury yacht industry evolving in terms of sustainability?

**E. KARANASIU:** Overall, the luxury yacht industry is making a significant shift towards a greener future by adopting sustainable fuels and renewable energy solutions, such as solar panels, alongside continuous innovations in design and technology. This transformation will be driven by client demand and potential new regulatory requirements.

How important is it for luxury yacht companies to engage in sustainability initiatives?

**E. KARANASIU:** Luxury yacht companies need to engage in sustainability initiatives. Given their significant resources and influence, these companies are well-positioned to lead by example. Commitment from the affluent is crucial in driving broader environmental change. By adopting sustainable practices, luxury yacht companies can set an industry standard, encourage innovation, and demonstrate that environmental responsibility is a priority, regardless of wealth. This leadership can inspire others to follow suit and contribute to a more sustainable future.



What are your thoughts on the Numarine Diesel-Electric Model 30 XP regarding sustainability standards, and how do you incorporate sustainable habits into your life onboard?

KARANASIU:** The Numarine Diesel-Electric Model 30XP is a testament to advanced sustainability, with its diesel-electric propulsion system designed to optimize fuel efficiency and reduce emissions. On a personal level, we make it a priority to navigate at the most energy-efficient cruising speed, further reducing our carbon footprint while enjoying the yacht's performance.

What future trends regarding sustainability do you foresee in the luxury yacht industry?

**E. KARANASIU:** In the future, the luxury yacht industry will likely see a rise in smart technology to optimize energy use, greater use of eco-friendly materials in construction, and a shift towards alternative fuels like biofuels and hydrogen. Additionally, integrating renewable energy sources such as solar panels and wind turbines will become more prevalent, contributing to a more sustainable yachting experience. This shift will also create a demand for a new, skilled workforce to support these advancements.



## EXPLORING INNOVATION AND SUSTAINABILITY WITH MALCOLM HUTCHISON

At Numarine, we're advancing yachting with cutting-edge technology focused on efficiency, sustainability, and comfort. Our diesel-electric propulsion system optimizes fuel efficiency by using electric motors powered by generators, reducing fuel waste and allowing for silent, zero-emission operation during slow manoeuvres from our onboard battery bank. Battery support is recharged during low-demand periods from the generators, while solar power supplements energy consumption.

Our Silent Line engineering minimizes noise and vibration by isolating machines and using sound-blocking materials, creating a quiet environment in the yacht's living spaces. The 30XP model, in particular, benefits from advanced sound isolation engineering.

Another standout feature is the foldable beach, which offers versatile, close-to-water space that adapts to varying conditions. Additionally, we've transitioned to wireless control switches, offering flexibility and ease of use. While not exactly smart home technology, our system uses tactile buttons with PLC control for a seamless user experience.

We also collaborate with Energy Solutions, Dief and Danfoss, leaders in electrical systems, to supply and power our motors and controllers, ensuring top-tier performance and reliability across all our yachts. This blend of innovation ensures that our yachts meet the demands of modern, eco-conscious sailors while maintaining luxury and performance.

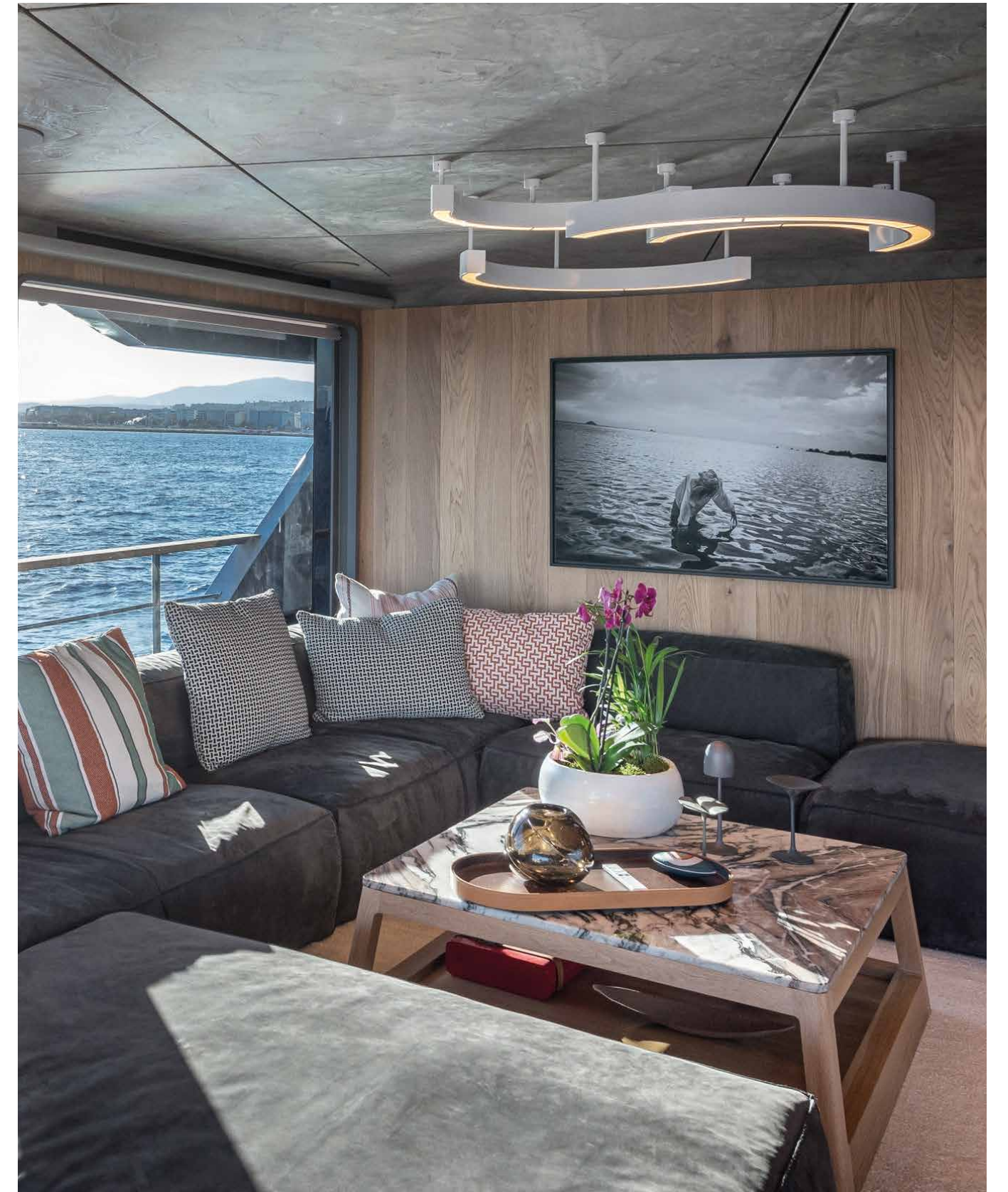

On the Numarine 30XP, the interplay of water, light, and nature served as the perfect inspiration for curating an artwork that complements both the yacht's surroundings and its refined interiors, transforming it into a sanctuary for its owner.

Living on their Numarine yacht in the height of the season, owners experience the perfect scenery: endless turquoise waters. Numarine's luxurious and spacious designs, with plentiful windows, invoke amazement from the moment you step onboard. As yacht owners with refined taste, making your home on the sea uniquely personal is key. There's no better way to achieve this than merging the two passions of yachting and art collecting.

Numarine's Explorers, crafted to explore remote lands and seas, allow owners to remain away from home ports for extended periods. On these journeys, art that enriches your yacht's interiors becomes essential. With a background in art history and experience in several museums and galleries, I had the opportunity to curate the living area in the first-ever manufactured Numarine 30XP.







I chose a photograph by one of my favourite artists, Cansu Yıldiran, titled "Aynı gökyüzü aynı keder" - meaning 'same sky, same fate'. Part of the artist's series "Barınak/Shelter", this work echoes the artist's mission to share stories of groups marginalized for their sexual identities and lifestyles. In black and white, the piece features a figure bending over backward, wearing a white, wrinkled shirt and curls hanging down their back. One hand is submerged in water, while the other barely touches it with fingertips. These and the person's facial expression all create a striking contrast with the water's marble-like surface. When looking closely, the fingers create small symmetric ripples that stand out against the wavy sea farther out. Sunlight breaking through the clouds and the contrasting reflections create a harmonious yet breathtaking display of light and shadow. Through contrast, focus, saturation, and exposure, the artist

captures an intensely personal moment. I was first drawn to Yıldiran's work for their remarkable skill in portraying intimate moments that explore what freedom and opportunity mean for Istanbul's youth seeking a sense of refuge. These moments can be hopeful, dark, or intense, yet they are always moving.

When selecting an artwork, I believe the most important criterion is that it's a work that you want to coexist with - one that feels like a true companion in your space. For some, this may mean works that spark joy, make them ask questions, offer new perspectives each day, or simply complement their personal sense of style. In curating the Numarine 30 XP - a vessel that lives upon water - choosing a work that captures the interplay of water and light, and evokes strong emotions, felt instinctive.

Numarine marks its momentous 20th anniversary year by introducing a groundbreaking addition to its esteemed range – the first-ever model equipped with diesel-electric propulsion. As the popularity of the 26XP and 32XP continues to soar, the 30XP strategically fills a void in Numarine's exceptional line-up. Already garnering significant interest, with three units sold, construction of the molds is well underway, with the first 30XP launched in August 2024.

A standout feature of the 30XP is its advanced noise and vibration control. Sound-reducing canopies, state-of-the-art insulation, and high-volume mounts ensure minimal noise from generators, while flexible couplings and thrust bearings further dampen vibrations. Lightweight partition walls enhance acoustic privacy, and the HVAC system incorporates specialized labyrinths to reduce sound, providing unmatched tranquility both at sea and at anchor.

Accommodating up to ten guests across five en suite staterooms, the yacht features a master stateroom on the main deck with floor-to-ceiling panoramic windows and unique bulwark cut-outs for stunning sea views. A fold-down balcony elevates the experience further.

The yacht's social spaces are equally remarkable. The main salon, with its expansive windows, offers an inviting retreat, while the aft deck and covered sundeck cater to open-air dining. A semi-open beach club at the stern maximizes space with an elevated design, creating a spacious 43 sqm area just steps below the main deck. Additional features include three fold-down platforms and a side-loading tender bay for a 5.65-meter tender.

Designed by Can Yalman and Ofist for interior; the raised pilothouse complements the yacht's elegant profile, while a forward sun pad provides a private lounging space. 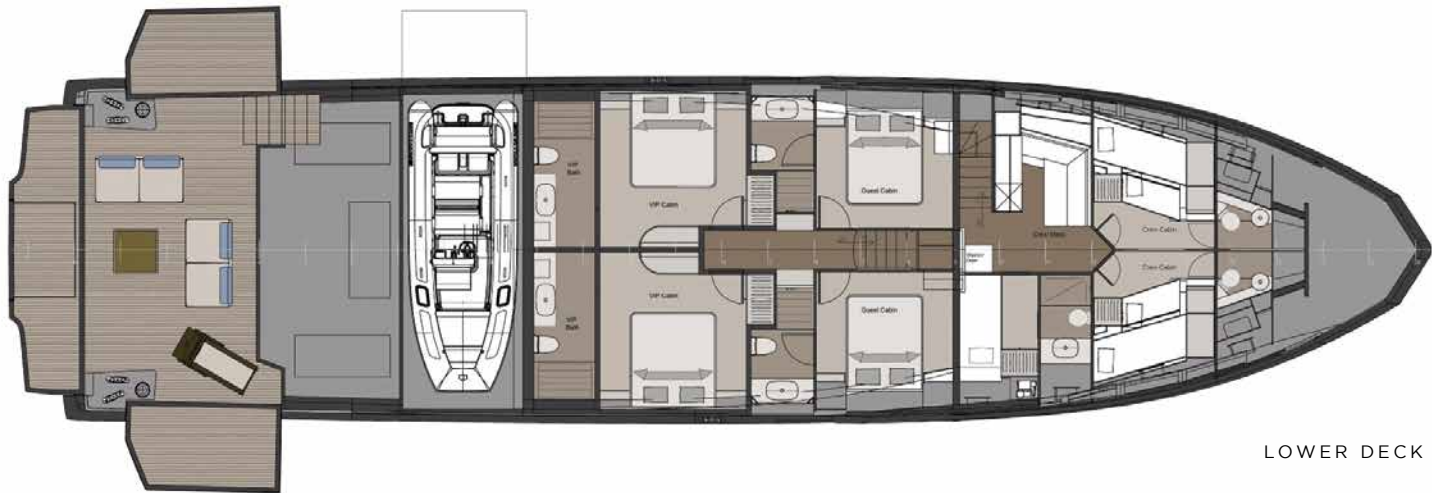

The exterior styling is by Can Yalman, who is the design partner of the brand. The 32XP silhouette is deliberately rugged, powerful and hefty, with extensive angular windows. Another contemporary feature added to the yacht is the vertical bow, and it makes cutting through the water an easy feat. The hull's shape, designed by Numarine's long-standing collaborator, naval architect Umberto Tagliavini, is beneficial to the internal volumes.

Yalman has also penned the interior. Like all Numarines, the interior of the 32XP is fully customized to reflect the owner's preferences in terms of layout, design, fabrics and materials. There is a spacious main salon and several outside areas to socialize, including a large couch area with Bimini and cocktail table forward of the wheelhouse and a huge flybridge.

Including the master suite forward on the main deck, the 32XP has six cabins. Another roomy VIP cabin is on the upper deck. It opens up via sliding doors to the incredibly large open deck. In navigation, it can even fit a spectacular 9-meter RIB tender and two PWCs with the help of the 2.5 Tons crane. Four additional guest cabins are placed on the lower deck. Below deck forward, the 5-person crew quarters provide ideal spaces for the captain with his private cabin & ensuite, and four crew members in two doubles with ensuite.

The 32XP accommodates up to 12 guests and is ready for long cruises with her proven hull and ample storage facilities. There is a designated owner's suite that provides additional space on the upper deck, which has direct access to the exterior terrace which is used as storage for a 9-meter tender while underway.

At 345 GT, the 37XP has plenty of room for socializing and relaxing across her four decks including a lower deck with generous spaces, huge windows and natural light. At the yacht's transom, a spacious beach club is complete with a bathing platform and an inside lounge open to the water. On the yacht's flybridge, 84 square-meters of alfresco space offers the perfect setting for sunbathing and dining.

# SNAPSHOT INTO YACHT TREND REPORT 2024

## EXPEDITION YACHTS: EXPLORING CURRENT TRENDS IN THE YACHT MARKET

According to the 2023 yacht report, which yacht enthusiasts eagerly awaited, although sales of new and second-hand yachts longer than 30 meters decreased slightly compared to last year, they managed to maintain their performance in the pre-Covid period. While new yacht sales decreased from 245 to 203, second-hand yacht sales decreased from 403 to 296.

There was a notable decline, especially in the new yacht segment between 30 and 50 meters, while sales of prestigious yachts longer than 80 meters decreased by more than a third. However, sales of new yachts between 50 and 80 meters decreased by 20%.



## CLOSE SCRUTINY OF THE INDUSTRY

The market slowed but remains robust! In 2023, sales of superyachts larger than 30 meters, both new and second-hand, were significantly lower compared to 2022 (and even compared to 2021), yet new yacht sales were still better off compared to the pre-Covid years of 2019 and 2020. The 203 new yacht sales recorded in 2023 place the year among the top 10 best-selling years. Sales in 2023 rank seventh after 2021, 2006-2008, 2022, and 2018.

On the other hand, second-hand yacht sales in 2023 showed a faster decline compared to new yacht sales, but with the sale of 296 yachts larger than 30 meters, it ranks sixth in the last decade (2014-2023) after 2021, 2022, 2020, 2018, and 2017. From a historical perspective, 2023 was not a bad year for second-hand yacht sales. However, we observed a significant increase in the amount and intensity of price discounts throughout 2023.

## THE THRIVING WORLD OF SUPERYACHTS

The global superyacht fleet, featuring yachts over 30 meters in length, boasted an impressive 5,787 superyachts in operation at the dawn of 2024. Adding to this maritime grandeur, around 109 superyachts are currently out of service, and approximately 213 have been completely lost since 1945.

## A DOMINANCE OF MOTOR YACHTS

Motor yachts dominate the scene, comprising 85% of the global fleet, while the remaining 15% are elegant sailing yachts. The year 2023 marked a significant milestone with the completion of 202 superyachts, a notable increase from 170 in 2022. This achievement is the highest number of completions recorded since 2010, reflecting the industry's robust growth and innovation.

## A SURGE IN PRODUCTION

In response to the order boom of 2021 and 2022, superyacht shipyards and their extensive supplier networks have significantly ramped up production. This surge culminated in a highly productive 2023, and the outlook for 2024 is equally optimistic, with expectations of around 205 new completions. The superyacht industry is not just about luxury; it's a testament to human ingenuity and the relentless pursuit of excellence on the high seas. As we sail into the future, the horizon looks bright for this glamorous sector.





### OVERVIEW OF FLEET TRENDS FOR 30-40 METRES

In 2023, the number of operating yachts between 30 and 40 metres grew to 3,663. Among these, 124 yachts were newly completed, marking the highest number of completions since 2009, when 138 yachts were completed. For 2024, we should expect a similar level of output as in 2023. The total number of projects under construction remained almost unchanged at 292.

### STEADY PRODUCTION IN TURKISH YARDS

Turkish shipyards in the 30-40 metre segment remains steady. The sailing yacht segment between 30 and 40 metres saw a strong completion in 2023 with seven completions, after dropping to only two completions in 2022. Three to four more sailing yachts in this size range are expected to be completed in 2024. For motor yachts between 30 and 40 metres, we expect a similar number of completions in 2024 as the 117 yachts completed in 2023.

### TRENDS IN 40-50 METRE FLEET

During 2023, the number of yachts operating between 40 and 50 metres rose to 1,244. With 45 completions, significantly higher than the five-year average of 37, 2023 marked a particularly strong year reversing the decline in completions over the past five years in this size range. Among the top five, Turkish shipyard Mengi-Yay completed eight yachts in this segment, up from just one in the previous period. The shipyard has launched a series of steel-hulled motor yachts that appear to have been well received based on sales figures. Despite a 9% decrease in the number of shipyards producing these yachts over the past five years, declining from 65 to 59, the construction backlog has increased in size from 170 to 180 yachts compared to last year's data, indicating a positive outlook for the segment.

Production of sailing yachts between 40 and 50 metres has increased over the past five years. Between 2019 and 2023, 27 sailing yachts of this size were completed, compared to 17 in

the preceding five-year period. There are currently a modest 14 yachts under construction in this segment, suggesting that achieving a similarly high level of completions as in the last five years is not assured for the upcoming five-year period.

### CONSTRUCTION BY COUNTRY

Italy, Turkey, The Netherlands and Germany dominate the superyacht construction industry, as they account for 85% of the number of superyachts in-build over 30 metres, and have an 88% share in terms of the total tonnage in-build, slightly up from last year's 85%.

### YACHT BY SALE 30-40 METRE MARKET

New yacht sales in the 30-40-metre segment were 18% lower during 2023, ending up at 108. While considerably lower than the figures we saw particularly in 2021 and 2022, any number over 100 can be considered as "good" as the result for 2023 still makes it into the top 10 over the last 20 years.

It is interesting to note the change in composition of the sales. The decline in sales can almost fully be attributed to a decline in sales of speculation projects as sales of projects started for the client remain unchanged at 74 sales, while speculation and stock sales dropped from 51 to 34. Also we noted no resales of in-build or on-hold projects during 2023 whereas we found six of those sales in 2022.

As noted in our previous report The State of Yachting 2023, only 76 speculation projects were started during 2022, leaving a low availability of those projects for the year 2023. So it could be that speculation sales mainly dropped because clients had fewer attractive projects to choose from. As we will see later on in this chapter, shipyards started to fill this gap during 2023 as the number of available speculation projects started to increase in the course of the year.

New sailing yacht sales in this segment were low at four yachts, the same number as seen in 2020, before the boom of 2021 and 2022.

Used yacht sales between 30 and 40 metres in 2023 saw a further decline. Sales decreased by 32% in 2023, compared to a 19% decline during 2022. In the end, 173 used yachts were sold in this segment in 2023. Put in a historical perspective, this is rather a low number. We have to go back to 2016 to see a similar number (174).

Used sailing yacht sales declined with the same speed as motor and sail combined in 2023. 20 used sailing yachts were sold in 2023, against 29 in 2022, a decline of 31%.

### 40-50 METER MARKET ANALYSIS

In 2023, the 40-50 meter yacht segment demonstrated relatively resilient performance compared to other segments. New yacht sales decreased by 10%, from 58 to 52 units. This decline was predominantly driven by a drop in sailing yacht sales, decreasing from seven to two units. Motor yacht sales, on the other hand, decreased by just one unit to 50. Excluding the four luxury private Croatian charter gulets included in the 2022 sailing yacht sales figures, it can be concluded that the 40-50 meter segment effectively maintained stability from 2022 to 2023.

Looking into the composition of new-build sales, projects initiated for clients still dominated with 26 sales, followed by 22 speculation sales and four resales. However, client-initiated project sales saw a significant decrease from 39 in 2022, while speculation sales increased from 16. The top-selling builder in this segment in 2023 was Sanlorenzo with 12 sales, surpassing Benetti, which secured second place with eight sales. Italian shipyards continued to dominate this segment, accounting for 38 out of 52 sales, representing a 73% market share.

The number of yachts under construction in this segment increased throughout 2023. By the end of the year, there were 25 speculation projects under construction, slated for delivery within the next two years—three more than the previous year, mirroring the increase observed in 2022. Additionally, five projects were listed for sale by their owners, three more than the previous year's two listings.

Similar to the previous year, used yacht sales in this segment decreased by almost a third, from 92 to 62 units. Sailing yacht sales saw a more significant decline compared to motor yachts, decreasing from 10 to five units.

### PAST PERFORMANCE AND FUTURE PROJECTIONS

In 2023, a total of 203 new superyachts exceeding 30 meters were sold, marking a second consecutive year of declining sales following the peak of 2021. Despite this downturn, the sales figure of 203 significantly surpassed our earlier forecast of 150 sales. This raises the question of whether new superyacht sales have permanently shifted to a higher level than previously anticipated. However, definitive conclusions on this trend remain uncertain at present.

Positive indicators such as the resilience of the US economy and the robust performance of the luxury goods market as of early 2024 continue to bolster optimism. Conversely, concerns about escalating conflicts in the Middle East and ongoing tensions in Ukraine have reportedly unsettled potential buyers, particularly those considering investments in large new-build yachts.

Looking ahead, we anticipate a gradual deceleration in new-build sales, with projections hovering around 180 yachts for 2024. This cautious outlook reflects a balanced assessment of current market dynamics and geopolitical uncertainties influencing buyer confidence in the luxury yachting sector.

### 2023 YACHTING TRENDS: TURKISH SHIPYARDS' IMPACT

In 2023, the yachting industry witnessed an 18% decline in new yacht sales within the 30-40 metre segment, totaling 108 sales, yet still marking one of the top 10 years in the past 20 years. Turkish shipyards, maintaining steady production, contributed significantly to this segment's dynamics, reflecting ongoing optimism amidst market challenges.





# MANAGING LITHIUM-ION BATTERY RISKS IN THE YACHTING

MALCOLM HUTCHISON

Recently, the yacht industry has been facing incidents of lithium-ion battery fires in equipment like scooters and water toys. At Numarine, we take these risks seriously and prioritize safety. Let's explore the causes and solutions of this issue from A to Z. Here are our recommendations.

## DEAR NUMARINE OWNERS AND CAPTAINS...

We have important information regarding lithium-ion battery safety. As we are sure you have seen, the yachting industry has recently experienced a spate of fires which are believed to be caused by the presence of malfunctioning Lithium-Ion batteries supplied with scooters and water toys.

The primary cause of the malfunction is "thermal runaway." This occurs when the battery's internal temperature exceeds its self-combustion point, leading to an uncontrollable exothermic reaction. This can be caused by damage to the battery, overcharging due to equipment failure, short circuit due to water ingress, or an external fire affecting the battery, to name a few.

### HOW MANY TYPES OF LITHIUM-ION BATTERIES/CELLS?

There are different types of Lithium-Ion batteries, and these are the ones most seen on yachts:

- Lithium Polymer (LiPo): Most commonly used in yachts.
- Lithium Nickel Manganese Cobalt (Li-NMC): Commonly found in scooters and some water toys.
- Lithium-iron Phosphate (LiFePO): Used in main battery groups - the newest and safest type for main battery banks.

### WHAT CAN YOU DO?

There are many more types that can be listed. You should know and understand the type of battery to operate and charge it safely.

At Numarine we take these risks very seriously and would like to highlight the dangers and offer some guidance to help in the prevention of fire.

For your scooters and water toys and all battery powered equipment not supplied as part of our yachts, don't keep the battery in the toy if possible, remove them and store them in a dry deck locker, somewhere easy to throw over the side if a fire occurs, charge the batteries also outside of the toy where possible and on deck where you can see them, if it's not possible to remove the battery to charge, charge the toy on deck in full sight. **Never leave batteries charging overnight unless you have night watch.** Check the toy regularly for damage and water ingress into the battery compartment. Be **AWARE** of the possible danger and make sure all the family and crew are also aware.

### WE USE THE MOST RESILIENT BATTERY

For batteries we supply or have supplied as main batteries, we have used Li-LMC on early systems and LiFePO on the recent systems. LiFePO are now the most resilient type to use due to the higher temperature level they can withstand. All our main battery systems have several control points for temperature control and charge control on the chargers and inside the batteries and via the battery management system, these systems are extensively tested and provide excellent safety records.



FOR SAFE USE: PLEASE BE MINDFUL

"BUT" there is risk should the batteries be made wet or are in a general engine room fire. It is important to protect the electronics of the battery from water, if a battery gets wet it should be removed from the system and yacht where possible, it may look OK but moisture could take hours to find its way into the electronics and the effect could be delayed, be safe, disconnect and remove to an open deck, dry any visible water and allow to air dry for 24 hours, it may be necessary to replace if water has entered the electronics. Have them professionally checked before replacing into use.

In case of an engine room fire, activate the fire extinguisher if it has not done so automatically to extinguish the fire, enter the engine room when safe to do so and check the temperature of the batteries. If there is no sign of smoke or fire do not use water to cool them but disconnect them and move them to an open deck area and monitor, have them professionally checked before replacing into use.

If you have no other option, throw them overboard to protect your life.

If the battery is burning or smoking, use water to cool the battery and keep applying water until the burning stops and temperature drops, then remove them to an open deck area where they can be monitored safely. Normally the application of water should be avoided BUT in extreme circumstances you are trying to prevent the battery igniting other materials around it.

There is always a possibility of explosion if batteries are on fire. Keep at a safe distance and behind a fire blanket. If you cannot extinguish the battery fire, be prepared to abandon the yacht into your tender or life raft.

WE OPERATE IN A SYSTEMATIC AND RELIABLE MANNER

Li-ion batteries are used worldwide in almost every aspect of daily life and have an excellent safety record despite recent high-profile incidents. As technology continues to evolve, these batteries are becoming increasingly safer. Understanding them and their potential risks is essential for safe usage. Yachts present a challenging environment for all types of equipment, so it's essential to stay vigilant and prioritize safety.

Numarine as we integrate more of these battery systems into our yachts are actively studying the safest way to install them, the most effective ways to deal with fire if it should occur and the best way for you to enjoy and cherish your yacht with the minimal risk.

This announcement is not intended to alarm you, as the main yacht system battery banks have impeccable safety records. However, we aim to raise awareness about potential risks associated with scooters, water toys, and external factors such as fires affecting these battery systems.
